This is a friendly reminder that fall 2025 proposals for the <u>PRI Seed Grant program</u> are due in <u>less than one month!</u> Application packages must be submitted no later than <u>October 1, 2025 at 5:00 p.m. ET</u> at <u>bit.ly/priseedgrant</u>.

The MSU <u>Plant Resilience Institute (PRI)</u> is seeking trainee-led proposals for collaborative projects exploring novel ideas in plant resilience research, broadly defined. The proposed research must not already be funded by an existing grant or part of a current research program. We encourage proposals to be synergistic across MSU laboratories and focus on projects that are both high-risk and high-reward.

Any MSU graduate student or postdoctoral researcher is eligible to submit a proposal, and proposals with graduate student lead PIs will be evaluated separately than those with postdoctoral lead PIs. **However, at least one Co-PI must be a member of a PRI lab.** Faculty members are **not** permitted to serve as PIs or Co-PIs, and individuals may participate as PI or Co-PI on only one proposal.

Successful proposals will receive a maximum of <u>\$10,000</u> for up to 18 months. The list of previously funded projects can be viewed <u>here</u>.

Proposals must be received by <u>October 1, 2025 at 5:00 p.m. ET</u> **for consideration.** Applications that were not selected in previous seed grant cycles can be resubmitted. Applications will be reviewed by the <u>PRI Seed Grant Committee</u>, and applicants will be notified of their proposal status by mid-October.
