Five of these programs are currently accepting applications. Click on the links below for more specific information about each program and the associated application.

[The FAST \(Future Academic Scholars in Teaching\) Fellows Program](#): For doctoral students with interests in teaching, learning, and assessment in higher education who are enrolled in programs associated with the Colleges of Natural Science, Agriculture and Natural Resources, Engineering, Social Science, and Veterinary Medicine or whose college or department has an approved Certification in College Teaching Program. Fellows propose and conduct a teaching intervention/research project of their own design. Application deadline March 20, 2017.

[IIT \(Interdisciplinary Inquiry and Teaching\) Fellowship Program](#): Based in the James Madison Residential College of Public Affairs, the IIT program welcomes applicants from all colleges whose teaching areas would be relevant to a college of public affairs and who are interested in teaching with technology. Fellows work with core JMC faculty to investigate theoretical and practical applications of interdisciplinary inquiry and research. Application deadline April 9, 2017.

[SUTL \(Scholarship of Undergraduate Teaching and Learning\) Fellows Program](#): Based in Lyman Briggs Residential College, the program is open to doctoral students in STEM, the history, philosophy and sociology of science, or other appropriate fields who are interested in working with an existing LBC disciplinary-based education research, scholarship of teaching and learning, or action research project. Application deadline April 14, 2017.

[RCAH \(Residential College in the Arts and Humanities\) Fellowship Program in Undergraduate Teaching and Learning](#): For doctoral students in programs associated with the Colleges of Arts and Letters, Music, Education, Social Science, Communications Arts and Sciences, and Agriculture and Natural Resources. In collaboration with RCAH faculty and administrators, fellows work toward completing a research project that contributes to the life of the RCAH and the scholarship of teaching and learning. Application deadline April 17, 2017.

[RCAH Language Fellowship Program in Undergraduate Teaching and Learning](#): Eligible graduate students who are enrolled in any MSU college and have (near) native fluency in one of the following language: French, Spanish, German and Less Commonly Taught Languages (e.g., American Sign Language, Arabic, Chinese, Hebrew, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Swahili, Vietnamese). Fellows facilitate weekly language immersion sessions for language learners and design and implement research projects on assessment, materials development, instructional delivery, and program evaluation. Application deadline April 17, 2017.
