# Study Tips

- What tips are you going to use to be successful this semester? Talk with your neighbor and then we'll share with the class.
- Did we get everything?
  - If you are struggling in a course, utilize campus resources right away. Do not be afraid or shy to ask for help!
  - Attend all your classes!
  - Sit at the front of the class (better location)
  - Complete all reading assignments before class
  - Use a planner to keep track of assignments, quizzes, and exams
  - Make a study plan 2 hrs outside class for every credit hour
  - Ask questions!
  - Go to your professor and teaching assistants' office hours
  - Form study groups and use tutoring resources

# Tutoring Resources (all free!)

- Math Learning Center (MLC) in C-125 Wells Hall and in the Neighborho0d Engagement Centers
- Chemistry Help Room offers tutoring in rooms 81 and 83 in the Chemistry Building. The hours are posted outside the door.
- <u>BioSci Help Room</u>, located N202 North Kedzie, offers free tutoring for BS 161, 162, 171, and 172
- <u>Statistics Help Room</u> is located in A102 Wells Hall
- <u>Writing Center</u> has free help with writing assignments
- The Physics Help Room for PHY 183 is 1248 Biomedical Physical Sciences. The hours are posted outside the door.
- <u>Social Science Help Room</u> offers tutoring for ISS, IAH, EC, HST, PLS, and SOC courses
- The English Language Lab for non-native English speakers

### **Overrides**

- If a class is full, you can sometimes get an enrollment override.
- If your took an equivalent course that is listed on the prerequisite list or you want to see if you can waive the prerequisites, you can request a prerequisite override.
- Overrides are handled by the department or program that administers the course.
- Got to <u>www.schedule.msu.edu</u>
  - Look up the course, and department contact information will be on this page. Some departments have online override forms on their home page (often under Undergraduate or Academics Tab).
  - If you can't find an override form, call the phone number listed.

# Meeting with Advisors

- Students can meet with Neighborhood advisors in the <u>Neighborhood Engagement Center for their residence</u> <u>halls</u>.
  - Off-campus students use North Engagement Center
- Minors also have advisors
- Most advisors across campus use the <u>Student Success</u> <u>Dashboard</u> for scheduling appts (you need to know the college - for Kendra, choose Natural Science Advising)
