The molecular biology study abroad program will provide MSU science students with a number of options for an 11-week mentored summer research experience at the Heinrich-Heine Universität Düsseldorf (HHUD).

The research experience will be complemented by a 2-credit advanced biology seminar course in Systems and Synthetic Biology, and immersion in the German culture, through the social contacts that will occur within the host laboratories and weekly participation in a German culture and language course on site at the HHUD.

Many opportunities for travel and exploration will be available on the weekends and after the completion of the eleven weeks of supervised research.

Düsseldorf is located in Germany's Rhine River Valley. It is a culturally sophisticated city with a population of about 600,000 inhabitants. Düsseldorf is served by an international airport, and is only a short distance from Holland and France.
